State of Hockey



- USA Hockey is sanctioning hockey this season
- Rinks are opening across the country
- Medical directors have deemed hockey can be played safely with appropriate precautions
- USA Hockey emailed details to members yesterday & information is available on their website under Player Safety
- In Oregon, rinks <u>are</u> planning to reopen & associations are working together on season plans
- Our rink is in regular communication with the Oregon Health Authority and Lane County Public Health for guidance

Safety Protocols



- Arrive with under layer on to participate in dryland, outside
- Dress outside of the rink to get on the ice (parking lot, vehicles)
- Logged and temperature checked at rink entrance
- Must wear a mask inside the rink except for players while on the ice*
- Coaches must wear masks
- No whistle use, limited bench use
- Only very minimal contact allowed; no full contact, checking, etc.

Safety Protocols



- Practice plans submitted ahead of time for COVID compliance
- No team water bottles
- Clean all shared equipment between practices
- Single direction exit after time on the ice
- 15 minutes before/after limit
- 10U & younger allowed one parent, must stay in the lobby
- 24-hour notice to families if positive case or exposure

Fees / Refunds / Finances



- Fees were set in May/June with the hopes of a normal season
 - We are still planning for this in terms of practices, games, etc.
- If the season is canceled, LAHA will issue refunds for the remaining portion of fees that have been paid
- Registration numbers are low started strong but has slowed
- Lower numbers (\sim 50%) = higher player costs
- LAHA will have to use reserve funds to cover losses unless we reach our registration target (100-120 players)

Registration Details



- Registration is online with TeamSnap; get USA Hockey # to register
- Register by Aug 31st to avoid a late fee
- During the registration process, you will need to download a packet
 - Consent to treat, codes of conduct, concussion fact sheets
- Forms <u>must</u> be signed and returned by email, uploaded to TeamSnap, or in person prior to first practice
- Uniforms will be distributed on designated uniform nights for each age division. Numbers will be given in order of registration.

USAH / OSHA Updates



USA Hockey

- Zero Tolerance Policy / Abuse of Officials
- Spectator monitors required by all teams at all games

Oregon State Hockey Association

- More clarity around youth rules, game formats, player development camp, etc. for statewide uniformity

Updated Codes of Conduct for Players & Parents

- All players and parents must have signed copies on file prior to being able to participate

- Issues will be documented and submitted to the LAHA Disciplinary Chair

Disciplinary Ladder: Player



Breach of Player Code of Conduct

Defined as non-compliance with <u>ANY</u> of the terms outlined in the Player Code of Conduct provided to and signed by the player at the start of the season.

- First Offense: Player is reminded of his/her agreement to comply and a copy of the signed code of conduct is provided to the player and their parent(s).
- Second Offense: Player does not play the next game but practice is mandatory.
- Third Offense: The player's offense record will be reviewed by the Discipline Committee and the Board of Directors and a decision of additional suspensions or expulsion from the program can be made.

*The Discipline Committee reserves the right to take more aggressive action based on the severity of the breach of the Player Code of Conduct.

Disciplinary Ladder: Parent



Breach of Parent Code of Conduct

Defined as non-compliance with <u>ANY</u> of the terms outlined in the Parent Code of Conduct provided to and signed by the parent at the start of the season.

- First Offense: Parent is addressed by the coaching staff of the team about the aspects of the code that are being broken and a copy of signed code is provided.
- Second Offense: Parent is given a warning letter from the Board of Directors that their behavior is in violation and they are asked to not be present at the next practice, game, and/or team function.
- Third Offense: Parent is given a letter from the Board of Directors requesting they no longer attend practices, games, and/or team functions but to please only provide transportation to and from the team events.

What to Expect this Season



- 3-4 teams at 8U, 1-2 teams at all other age groups
- Practices 3 times per week & 3-4 times per week for the 14U and 18U teams
- Dryland will take place before scheduled ice time
- Teams will practice separately most of the time
- Expect player movement in practices
- Players may only wear white or navy Jr. Generals jerseys for LAHA practices — they can wear last year's jerseys or purchase from the rink store

What to Expect this Season



- Teams will be small to allow for in-house play and social distancing on the benches
- Expect player movement in games
- Expect modified game formats (i.e. 3v3 cross ice, etc.)
- Players may only wear their issued uniforms for games, no alternate items will be allowed (i.e. different socks)
- Early season games are going to be all in-house
- Statewide scheduling meeting is set for September when the other rinks are closer to opening and programs know there registration numbers

What to Expect this Season



- Tournaments likely to be in-state only, TBA
- Every Oregon association plans on hosting tournaments
- LAHA planning on hosting 14/18U Holiday Cup in December and 10/12U Ice Cup in February
- OSHA is planning for the jamborees and state tournaments
- LAHA will be offering Skills Clinics & Girls Clinics
- LAHA will continue to offer Goalie practices
- All families are asked to volunteer a minimum of 8 hours
