





In general, my player enjoyed this season.




Satisfaction with the cost of the program




Satisfaction with the number of games




Satisfaction with the amount of travel this season




Current satisfaction with the level of competitiveness of teams within the state




Does your player enjoy Super Weekends (3-4 games over 2 days)?




Satisfaction with skill development




Satisfaction with the number of practices




Would you support the creation of A and B teams at certain levels next season



If your player did not make the A team, would they still continue to play with LAHA on a B team? 43 responses




Do you support the creation of "Select Only" teams at 14U and above? These teams would play additional games and/or tournaments.




For 14U and 18U: Is your player comfortable playing full contact/checking games vs. competitive contact games?




Will your player be returning to LAHA next season?

Overall Satisfaction:

 Mostly Positive: The majority of respondents were satisfied or very satisfied with the program.

Common Praise:

- Dedicated Coaching Staff: Many appreciated the coaches' commitment and positive influence on players.
- Player Development: Notable growth in skills and personal development.
- o Fun & Enjoyment: Players had fun, made friends, and enjoyed the season.
- First-Year Success: First-time families had positive experiences and felt welcomed.

Areas for Improvement:

• Communication Issues:

- Poor communication between coaches and families (especially at 14U and 18U levels).
- Lack of transparency and clarity around schedules and planning.

• Team Structure:

- Multiple comments about the need to split teams by skill level (A/B teams or travel/house distinctions).
- Concern over mixing brand new skaters with experienced ones, which limits competitive development.

• Practice & Game Balance:

- Desire for more full-ice time, more games, or an additional tournament.
- Over-scheduling with too many "super weekends" and excessive travel was a major concern.

• Organizational Issues:

- Lack of a team manager in some cases led to disorganization and exclusion of newer families.
- Mixed feedback about how feedback from parents was received or ignored by the board.

Cost & Value:

 A few mentioned the program is too expensive, especially considering shortened seasons or missed games.

★ Suggestions & Specific Requests:

- Implement A/B team structure at 12U, 14U, and 18U levels.
- Improve **communication channels** between coaches, board, and families.
- Reduce travel and reconsider the frequency of super weekends.
- Provide more structured practices and skill-specific drills.
- Offer more opportunities for advanced players to grow and compete.

Top Suggestions:

- Add weekly dedicated skating sessions.
- Provide separate goalie training during team practices.
- Use **skill-level-based practice groups** across all divisions.
- Focus more on **shooting**, **passing**, **and positional play** as players advance.
- Consider bringing in external coaches or specialists for clinics.
